# Some Facts and Figures

- **45%** of students have a PC in their bedroom
- **96%** go on-line at home to play games and socialise
- **46%** use a Webcam
- Around **20%** have met an online “friend” in real life
- Only **a third** of those students took a responsible adult with them

# The school's position

- The Curriculum (ICT / PHSCE)
- ICT Acceptable Use Policy (AUP)
- Filtering systems
- Monitoring systems
- Links with Pastoral / House Teams
- Mobile Devices
- The school can only monitor and guide students *at school*



# How parents can help

- Talk to your child about e-safety
- Lock social website / IM settings down
- Consider where your child uses their PC



# How parents can help

- Install protective monitoring software  
(e.g. CyberPatrol\*)
- Check Anti-Virus and Firewall is installed and kept up to date (e.g. AVG, Avast, Symantic, Mcafee\*)
- Check P2P / Torrent software is not installed
- Check WiFi security settings  
Use WPA settings if available. Refer to manual.
